Programme overview

All seminars are non-syllabus based and will explore good teaching practice and the foundations of classical ballet technique. Each day includes both theoretical and practical elements. Teachers can gain valuable CPD experience by taking part in the inspirational series and can benefit from a unique networking opportunity.

Each seminar can be attended as a one-off event however it is recommend that, over time, teachers experience all six seminars in order to develop a comprehensive understanding of the full *Inspire* series. Teachers can take the seminars in any order, however it is recommended that they be taken sequentially.

Seminar One: The Foundations of Classical Ballet

Aims:

- To provide a practical workshop for teachers that explores the basic concepts of classical ballet technique
- To highlight the importance of the foundations of classical ballet technique including posture, placement, use of turn-out and weight placement
- To explore the mechanics and aesthetics of port de bras
- To introduce the concept of good teaching, leading towards the development of a personal philosophy of teaching

- To explore how students learn and effective teaching practice

- To highlight how classical ballet vocabulary progresses from the barre to the centre
- To develop skill in teaching centre practice
- To explore effective communication
- To develop skills in the demonstration of enchaînement and the use of voice in delivering a lesson
