Whether a teacher, teaching assistant, parent, guardian, responsible adult, or carer:

DO:

- ✓ Be accessible and receptive
- \checkmark Listen carefully and ask open questions only to clarify (e.g. who, what, when, where, how)
- ✓ Take it seriously
- ✓ Reassure the child they are right to tell
- √ Negotiate getting help
- ✓ Explain that you will have to tell someone else for this to stop
- √ Report all suspicions or disclosures immediately to the relevant people and/or childcare organisations and: <u>ATAPsupport@royalballetschool.org.uk</u>
- ✓ Make careful and factual records of what was said as soon as possible.

DO NOT:

- X Look horrified and say something speculative
- X Try to get the child to disclose
- X Accuse anyone or pass judgement
- X Ask any leading questions whatsoever
- X Make promises you cannot keep
- X Forget to record and report the disclosure
